Language:	<p>Respondent shall not order, prescribe, dispense, administer, <u>furnish</u>, or possess any controlled substances as defined in the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act.</p> <p>Respondent shall not issue an oral or written recommendation or approval to a patient or a patient’s primary caregiver for the possession or cultivation of marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 11362.5.</p> <p>If respondent forms the medical opinion, after a <u>an appropriate good faith</u> prior examination <u>and a medical indication</u>, that a patient’s medical condition may benefit from the use of marijuana, respondent shall so inform the patient and shall refer the patient to another physician who, following <u>an appropriate prior good faith</u> examination <u>and a medical indication</u>, may independently issue a medically appropriate recommendation or approval for the possession or cultivation of marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 11362.5. Thereafter, respondent shall not reapply for a new DEA permit without the prior written consent of the Board or its designee.

Language:	<p>Respondent shall not order, prescribe, dispense, administer, <u>furnish</u>, or possess any controlled substances as defined by the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act, except for those drugs listed in Schedule(s) _____ (e.g., IV and V) of the Act.</p> <p>Respondent shall not issue an oral or written recommendation or approval to a patient or a patient’s primary caregiver for the possession or cultivation of marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 11362.5. If respondent forms the medical opinion, after an <u>appropriate good faith</u> prior examination <u>and medical indication</u>, that a patient’s medical condition may benefit from the use of marijuana, respondent shall so inform the patient and shall refer the patient to another physician who, following an <u>appropriate prior good faith</u> examination <u>and medical indication</u>, may independently issue a medically appropriate recommendation or approval for the possession or cultivation of marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 11362.5. In addition, respondent shall inform the patient or the patient’s primary caregiver that respondent is prohibited from issuing a recommendation or approval for the possession or cultivation of marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient and that the patient or the patient’s primary caregiver may not rely on respondent’s statements to legally possess or cultivate marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient. Title:	Controlled Substances – Maintain Records and Access to Records and Inventories
Language:	<p>Respondent shall maintain a record of all controlled substances ordered, prescribed, dispensed, administered, or possessed by respondent, and any recommendation or approval which enables a patient or patient’s primary caregiver to possess or cultivate marijuana for the personal medical purposes of the patient within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 11362.5, during probation, showing all the following: 1) the name and address of patient; 2) the date; 3) the character and quantity of controlled substances involved; and 4) the indications and diagnosis for which the controlled substances were furnished.</p> <p>Respondent shall keep these records in a separate file or ledger, in chronological order. All records and any inventories of controlled substances shall be available for immediate inspection and copying on the premises by the Board or its designee at all times during business hours and shall be retained for the entire term of probation.</p> <p>Failure to maintain all records, to provide immediate access to the inventory, or to make all records available for immediate inspection and copying on the premises, is a violation of probation.</p>

Title:	Controlled Substances – Abstain From Use
Language:	<p>Respondent shall abstain completely from the personal use or possession of controlled substances as defined in the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act, dangerous drugs as defined by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and any drugs requiring a prescription. This prohibition does not apply to medications lawfully prescribed to respondent by another practitioner for a bona fide illness or condition.</p> <p>Within 15 calendar days of receiving any <u>lawfully prescribed</u> lawful prescription medications, respondent shall notify the Board or its designee of the: issuing practitioner’s name, address, and telephone number; medication name, and <u>strength, and quantity</u>; and issuing pharmacy name, address, and telephone number.</p> <p><u>If respondent has a positive biological fluid test for any substance not legally prescribed and not reported to the Board or its designee, respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified. The respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until final decision on an accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation. An accusation and/or petition to revoke probation shall be filed by the Board within 15 days of the notification to cease practice. If the respondent requests a hearing on the accusation and/or petition to revoke probation, the Board shall provide the respondent with a hearing within 30 days of the request, unless the respondent stipulates to a later hearing. A decision shall be received from the Administrative Law Judge or the Board within 15 days unless good cause can be shown for the delay. The cessation of practice shall not apply to the reduction of the probationary time period.</u></p> <p><u>If the Board does not file an accusation or petition to revoke probation within 15 days of the issuance of the notification to cease practice or does not provide respondent with a hearing within 30 days of a such a request, the notification of cease practice shall be dissolved.</u></p>

Title:	Alcohol – Abstain From Use
Language:	<p>Respondent shall abstain completely from the use of products or beverages containing alcohol.</p> <p><u>If respondent has a positive biological fluid test for alcohol, respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified. The respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until final decision on an accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation. An accusation and/or petition to revoke probation shall be filed by the Board within 15 days of the notification to cease practice. If the respondent requests a hearing on the accusation and/or petition to revoke probation, the Board shall provide the respondent with a hearing within 30 days of the request, unless the respondent stipulates to a later hearing. A decision shall be received from the Administrative Law Judge or the Board within 15 days unless good cause can be shown for the delay. Title:	Biological Fluid Testing
Language:	<p>Respondent shall immediately submit to biological fluid testing, at respondent's expense, upon request of the Board or its designee. <u>“Biological fluid testing” may include, but is not limited to, urine, blood, breathalyzer, hair follicle testing, or similar drug screening approved by the Board or its designee. Within 30 calendar days of this Decision, Prior to practicing medicine, respondent shall, at respondent's expense, contract with a laboratory or service approved in advance by the Board or its designee that will conduct random, unannounced, observed, urine biological fluid testing a minimum of four times each month. The contract shall require results of the urine tests to be transmitted by the laboratory or service directly to the Board or its designee within four hours of the results becoming available. Respondent shall Failure to maintain this laboratory or service contract during the period of probation is a violation of probation.</u></p>

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<p>11 Continued</p>	<p>A certified copy of any laboratory test result may be received in evidence in any proceedings between the Board and respondent. Failure to submit to or comply with the time frame for submitting to, or failure to complete the required biological fluid testing, is a violation of probation."</p> <p><u>If respondent fails to cooperate in a random biological fluid testing program within the specified time frame, respondent shall receive a notification from the Board or its designee to cease the practice of medicine within three (3) calendar days after being so notified. The respondent shall not resume the practice of medicine until final decision on an accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation. An accusation and/or petition to revoke probation shall be filed by the Board within 15 days of the notification to cease practice. If the respondent requests a hearing on the accusation and/or petition to revoke probation, the Board shall provide the respondent with a hearing within 30 days of the request, unless the respondent stipulates to a later hearing. A decision shall be received from the Administrative Law Judge or the Board within 15 days unless good cause can be shown for the delay. The educational program(s) or course(s) shall be aimed at correcting any areas of deficient practice or knowledge and shall be Category I certified. limited to classroom, conference, or seminar settings. The educational program(s) or course(s) shall be at respondent's expense and shall be in addition to the Continuing Medical Education (CME) requirements for renewal of licensure. Following the completion of each course, the Board or its designee may administer an examination to test respondent's knowledge of the course. Respondent shall provide proof of attendance for 65 hours of CME of which 40 hours were in satisfaction of this condition.</p>

Failure to successfully complete the course during the first year of probation is a violation of probation. Respondent shall participate in and successfully complete that program. Respondent shall provide any information and documents that the program may deem pertinent. Respondent shall successfully complete the classroom component of the program not later than six (6) months after respondent's initial enrollment, and the longitudinal component of the program not later than the time specified by the program, but no later than one (1) year after attending the classroom component. Respondent, at the Program's discretion, shall undergo and complete the Program's assessment of respondent's competency, mental health and/or neuropsychological performance, and at minimum, a 24 hour program of interactive education and training in the area of boundaries, which takes into account data obtained from the assessment and from the Decision(s), Accusation(s) and any other information that the Board or its designee deems relevant. The Program shall evaluate respondent at the end of the training and the Program shall provide any data from the assessment and training as well as the results of the evaluation to the Board or its designee.</p> <p>Failure to complete the entire Program not later than six (6) months after respondent's initial enrollment shall constitute a violation of probation unless the Board or its designee agrees in writing to a later time for completion. Based on respondent's performance in and evaluations from the assessment, education, and training, the Program shall advise the Board or its designee of its recommendation(s) for additional education, training, psychotherapy and other measures necessary to ensure that respondent can practice medicine safely. Respondent shall comply with Program recommendations. At the completion of the Program, respondent shall submit to a final evaluation.
