Dear Committee:

I have been practicing Obstetrics and Gynecology in a private practice setting since 1998. I have been the supervising physician and consulting physician for several community and hospital-based midwives since 2007. I started my own midwifery practice in 2010. I opened 2 in hospital birthing centers in Southern California.

My appreciation for physiologic birth started with my affiliation with a group of midwives when I moved to Laguna Beach in 2007. Coming from New York City where the medical model of obstetrics was heavily practiced, I slowly adopted a new approach to holistic obstetrics. I accepted more patient autonomy, associated myself with the natural birthing community and helped build our own natural birthing environment.

I was the founder and Director of Midwifery services at Providence Hospital in Mission Viejo. I am currently the Director of Midwifery services at Hoag Hospital in Orange County. I am presently responsible for 6 full time Certified Nurse Midwives where they do approximately 60 deliveries monthly. I lead their monthly meetings which include high risk consults, patient case reviews and lectures on current Obstetric and Gynecologic issues. I helped establish guidelines, procedures, and protocols for both an independent birthing center and two in-hospital birthing centers. I was completely and independently responsible for the Midwife practice and their patients for 10 years.

I believe I would be an excellent asset to this committee due to my tremendous passion for midwifery care. I subscribe to the Midwife model of care and have been trying to help Midwives gain a foothold in our community for over 10 years. My experience establishing several midwife practices and authoring the procedures and protocols makes me knowledgeable in running a practice, leading a practice, and troubleshooting issues and complications that may arise.
