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Roseville Physician Surrenders License to Practice Medicine

SACRAMENTO – The Medical Board has adopted the stipulated surrender of Adam C. Duer's license to practice medicine in the state of California, effective January 1, 2017. "The Medical Board's primary mission is public protection and this action reflects the Board's ongoing commitment to that mission," said the Board's executive director Kimberly Kirchmeyer.

In summary, on June 24, 2014, an Accusation was filed against Duer. The Accusation involved gross negligence, prescribing to an addict, and excessive prescribing for five patients, as well as a cause of action involving repeated negligent acts against these five and a sixth patient.
